The information found in these parish books primarily names families in Monroe County, but there is mention of people from many locations in southeast Ohio, including Noble, Washington, Belmont, Jefferson and Guernsey Counties, Ohio as well as Wheeling, WV and Pittsburgh, PA. There is also mention of individuals living in other parts of the United States. These records represent a major source of information on the European origins for these immigrants to Monroe County, Ohio. Dates of the records were approximately from 1831-1948, but some birth dates were much earlier than the years when family records were entered. The Miltonsburg parish of St. Peter's is located today in Malaga Township, Monroe County. Lewisville is also located in Summit Township, Monroe County. The book includes family book records, baptism, confirmation, marriage and death records as well as European places of origin for these Monroe County families. What a find! Index.</p>	\$26.00
