INTRODUCTION

A bracket around a last name in the transcription means that this name is not given on that line of the marker, but is taken from other information, i.e. Mary Smith, wife of John Jones, is shown as Mary Smith [Jones]. Brackets around other information have a similar meaning.

Where a married woman's maiden name is indicated on the cemetery marker, the woman is indexed under both her married and maiden name, i.e. Mrs. Mary Smith Jones is indexed as Jones, Mary Smith; and Smith, Mary (Jones). The parenthesis around the last name indicates that this is her married name. However, not all women are so indicated and indexed.

The additional information given in a box below the cemetery transcription is taken from other documented information, such as newspapers published at the time of death.
